# Comparative study about the volunteer management in Europe

The Reference Centre has collated a comparative study on the volunteer management in 15 European National Societies. This study has been undertaken with contribution from the heads of volunteering in each National Society and incorporates key information about the national strategies/policies on volunteering, the way these National Societies finance their volunteer initiatives at both a national and regional level, the volunteer management cycle, the existence of disciplinary procedures, the average profile of a European volunteer, materials edited to provide information about the Red Cross, databases, training, etc.

This study is in its phase of validation by the National Societies that have taken part in it, and will be posted in the website of the Reference Centre on Volunteering next November.

# Agreements of the last WENDOV meeting

The last meeting of the Western European Network for the Development of Volunteering (WENDOV), took place in Copenhagen from 13 to 15 of October., The main decisions that were adopted are the following:

To modify the name of the network and remove the western component that has been used up until now.

To invite to the next meeting not only members of the former WENDOV, but also National Red Cross Societies of those countries of recent access or in situation of preaccess to the European Union.

The open participation to the network to those National Societies whose countries are currently not members of the European Union, and that belong to the region Europe delimited by the IFRC.

During the meeting, the participants had the opportunity to identify their successes and challenges in the area of volunteering, and to exchange information about volunteering management implemented by the different National Societies following the events of the Tsunami.

This network is currently chaired by Marita Salo, Organizational Development Co-ordinator for the Finnish Red Cross.
