- **Co-development in cooperation with other NGOs**: information and advice in countries of origin, support to families who are in vulnerable situations, income-generating activities, psychosocial support, awareness of human rights and migration values (eg partnership between CRE, Peruvian embassy, CEDEAL)

Initial Reception and Tranfer

- First Reception: migrants arrived at Ceuta, Melilla, Canary Islands and other Spanish coasts (SRC Centers and Hostels) Stay for a period of 15 days.
- First Reception: asylum seekers (hostels) during the medical examination and interview (up to a month).
- Services: accommodation, food, clothing, financial support (pocket money), health (health card), transports, environmental awareness courses, language courses, legal advice (documentation, information on the fundamental rights and duties, registration), psychological support, etc.

Temporary Reception Centers

- Centers for migrants and / or asylum seekers:
 - Belonging to the Government
 - Belonging to SRC or other NGOs
- Maximum stay between 6 and 12 months (exceptional extension)

Services:

- Accomodation, food and basic needs
- Legal advice
- Basic training: knowledge of the Spanish context and language.
- Vocational training and job search
- Psychosocial support
- Translation and interpretation
- Social mediation
- Support to children education

Employment

SRC- Employment plan for vulnerable groups

Personalized itineries for social and labor integration`

- Information and guidance
- Training in personal and social skills
- Vocational training
- Stage in companies
- Intermediation with companies and monitoring
- Self-employment support (evaluation of business ideas, business development projects, counseling, microcredit, monitoring)
- Access to employment through ICT.

Residential Centers

- Centers for unaccompanied minors (6 centers)
- Sheltered housing for the emancipation (14 units over 18 years)
- Services: food and lodging, socio-educational support, access to public resources - non-formal schooling and training – leisure activities, cultural mediation, access to employment, ...

Prevention of social exclusion and integration of youth involved in the migration processes (Cadiz, Huelva and Valladolid) Prevention of social exclusion and violence, support to school success, generational conflict prevention

CRoNO

Project for social and educational inclusion of unaccompanied minors. Volunteers acting as community focal points for integration of children.



Awareness. Fight against discrimination, racism and xenophobia

Itinerant exhibition "Aprende a mirar de cerca" ("Learn to look closely")

Approximate number of visitors: 50,000 (presented in 33 cities). Awareness campaign to combat stereotypes and discrimination and provide a normalized image of migrants

Itinerant exhibition "En la otra orilla" ("On the other side") Workshops aiming at rising awarness on social and public workes, media representatives, etc.

Bembea Project (EQUAL UE Initiative).

Development and validation of various advocacy strategies to combat discrimination, especially in the workplace, in partnership with other NGOs

Other activities: videoforums, television spots, public awareness campaigns through virtual marketing, development of methodological guidelines for intercultural awareness, ...

Lessons learned

Migration is a right and a personal choice to improve living conditions.

However, the migration project involves substantial risks, particularly for vulnerable people (migrants in irregular situation, victims of trafficking, children, etc.).

To help migrants, the Red Cross intervention should cover all situations: in the countries of origin and transit as well as in receiving countries

Lessons learned

Awareness activities, humanitarian diplomacy and advocacy are a key tasks for the Red Cross and Red Crescent National Societies

Facilitate the integration of migrants means working with the person but also working with the community

Discrimination based on stereotypes is the biggest barrier to achieving integration
