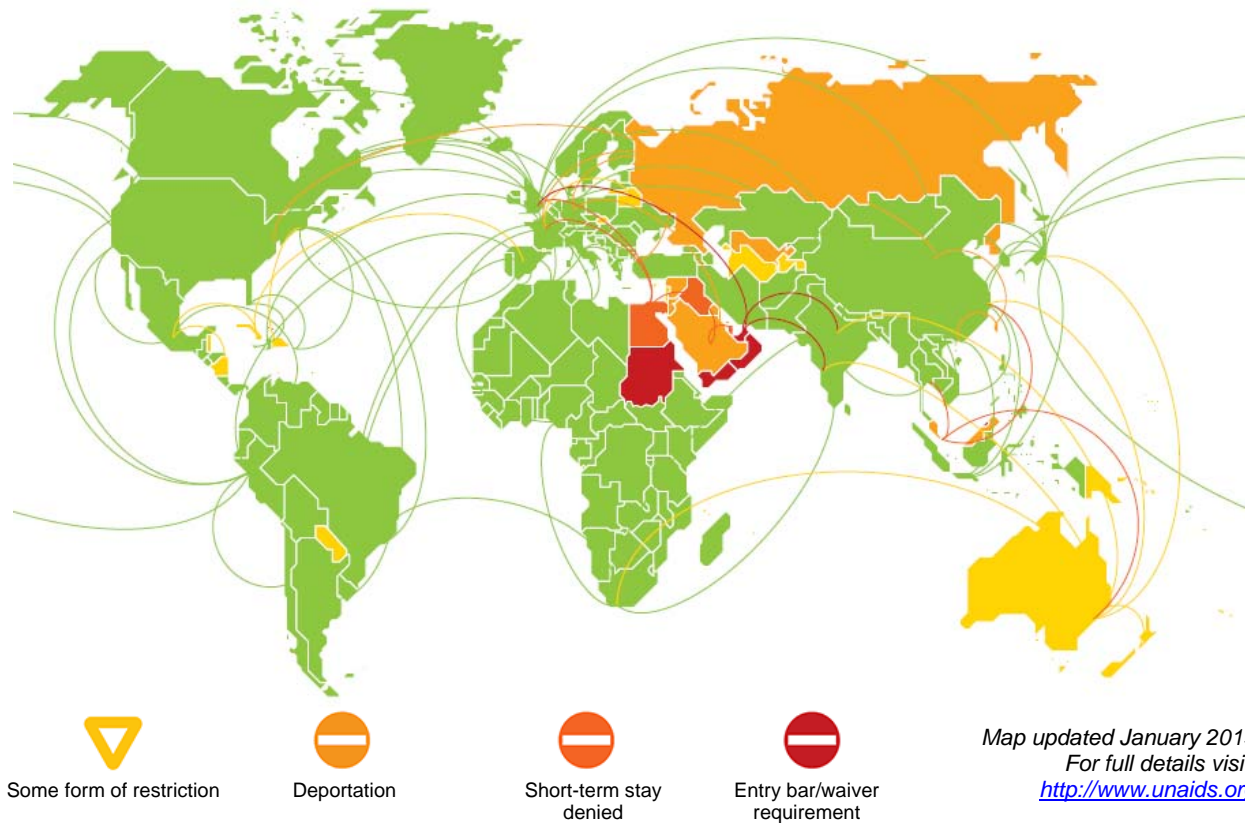


HIV-related restrictions on entry, stay and residence

According to the publication *Mapping of Restrictions on the entry, stay and residence of people living with HIV* (UNAIDS, May 2009), and latest developments as of January 2013:

- **44 countries**, territories, and areas impose some form of restriction on the entry, stay and residence of people living with HIV based on their HIV status:
